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Since completing her PhD she has found her work increasingly intersecting with other disciplines such as inclusive education and digital humanities. She worked as a postdoc at King's College London on a project on e-Inclusion and Foreign Language Learning and is currently carrying out a research project on *e-Inclusion and Foreign Language Teaching* at Fitzwilliam College, University of Cambridge, funded by the Batista i Roca Fellowship.

She is a language instructor in Spanish at Queen Mary, University of London, and has previously taught Catalan as a foreign language in Cambridge University and English as a foreign language in Universitat Jaume I, Spain. She is also interested in Sign Languages and has Level 1 British Sign Language skills.

She has published articles on applied linguistics, language acquisition, inclusive education and digital technology. Her work has been presented at national and international conferences such as Asociación Española de Lingüística Aplicada (AESLA), the British Educational Research Association (BERA) and the European Association for Computer-Assisted Language Learning (EUROCALL). She was the Editor in Chief of the Proceedings of the Cambridge Third Postgraduate Conference in Language Research (2005) and was on the editorial board of the Proceedings of the Cambridge Forth Postgraduate Conference in Language Research (2006).
